- <u>TODAY</u> [1] With the **Fourth Sunday of Advent'** the Church's Liturgy turns to preparing us more immediately for our remembrance of the Birth of Jesus but so that we can yearn for the Re-Birth of the entire Creation in Christ at His Final Coming. We hear the Gospel of the Visitation Mary, carrying Jesus in her womb, hurries across the hill country to greet Elizabeth, carrying John the Baptist in her womb. All human hope (John) leaps for joy at meeting God's entire self-giving (Jesus) that fulfils all human hope.
- [2] We **bless the Christmas Tree** during this 10am Mass the Tree that symbolises both the tree of our Fall (the First Adam) and the Tree of our Redemption (the Second Adam Christ). Parents if you have a christmas Tree in your home, why not gather your children around it and bless it on Christmas Eve?
- [3] A very beautiful **Advent Evening Prayer (incorporating the Great O Antiphons)** with **Adoration** at 1.00pm do come!

NEXT SUNDAY [1] We celebrate the beautiful **Feast of the Holy Family**. A day to give thanks for our families, to hold each other with love, to pray for those families separated for whatever reason, but especially because of fleeing terror and war. A time to care for those who have no families. A day to rejoice that God comes into our families with tender love.

CALLING ALL EU (European Union) CITIZENS - ALL WHO HAVE EU PASSPORTS
At a meeting in London this past week of Catholic Migrant Officers (and European national chaplains) from around England and Wales (sponsored by the Bishops' Conference), we examined the arrangements for all EU citizens (those holding EU passports, including their children born in UK) after 'Brexit'. Although clearly there is now doubt about 'Brexit', nevertheless it is vitally important that those concerned (which includes for instance people from Latin America holding Spanish passport and from Angola, East Timor etc holding Portuguese passports) understand the steps they need to take if they wish to remain in UK after 31st December 2020. It is relatively simple in most cases, but you must apply to the 'EU Settlement Scheme' from April 2019 and before end of June 2021. We are going to explore how our parish community can support our sisters and brothers in applying for Permanent Settled Status. Meanwhile, for more information visit: www.gov.uk/eu-settled-status
