

JESUS IN THE SYNAGOGUE!

Today is **Holocaust Memorial Day** - a sober day for every Christian knowing that the extermination of 7.5 million Jews happened because of centuries of Christian antisemitism. We have denied our origins and roots in the ancient Covenants we share with our Jewish brothers and sisters. We have forgotten that the Lord Jesus we serve is Jewish. We have ignored that our worship, liturgy and especially the Eucharist owes so much to Jewish worship.

So Jesus goes to His home synagogue ('as he usually did') - proclaims the ancient prophecy, standing in the rich tradition of Old Testament prophets. As He unrolls the sacred scroll He unfolds the fullness of the Word and inaugurates the Age of the Spirit, the Age of the Jubilee.

It all begins in the Synagogue - the spiritual home and school of His beloved People of the Covenant. Our faith begins in the Synagogue - to love Jesus is to reverence our Jewish roots and family.

<u>ANEW MINISTRY - WELCOMING THE LBGT+ COMMUNITY</u> More than a year ago our Parish Pastoral Council wrote to Bishop Declan suggesting that somewhere in the diocese there should be a regular Mass celebrated at which the Gay community (LGBT+ means 'Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual and Trans-sexual') can experience welcome rather than rejection, acceptance rather than judgement. A number of bishops in England have authorised such Masses, taking a lead from Cardinal Vincent Nichols of Westminster (who has support-

ed such a Mass in London for some years). After some prayer, reflection and discussion, Bishop Declan has agreed to this proposal and asked St Nicks (because of our reputation as a welcoming community) to host such Masses and develop a ministry among the Gay community. As your Parish Pastoral Council we realise that for some, perhaps many, in our community this is a very challenging development and perhaps hard to understand. So many of us have been brought up to judge and condemn those whose sexual orientation is different from most of us. So before we begin celebrating such Masses (the first will be on Sunday 17th March at 3.00pm) we want to give everyone the opportunity to discuss this development, ask their questions, speak their voice and be heard in a mutually respectful way. So there will be an open meeting after Mass on Sunday 10th February beginning around 12.45pm. Do come to both speak and to listen.

JOB VACANCY IN DIOCESAN FINANCE TEAM - OPAS Support Administrator
