## **FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT**



# SHADOWS TEMPTING US INTO THE DARKNESS EVEN FOR JESUS!

How hard it is to believe that Jesus really is our brother - really as human as we are. If He were not, then He could not redeem us! What Jesus has not shared, Jesus has not redeemed. So He shares with us our wrestling with our inner shadows, our struggles with our inner 'demons'. Being Son of God did not exempt Him from the struggles and the pain - anymore than it exempted Him from suffering and death. For He would not be human if He was exempted: and if He is not utterly human, then we are not saved.

So His struggles with the shadows of the Ego, the self-serving self (use the power to make yourself popular, powerful, wealthy!) are real, not symbolic; the demons tempting Him to avoid suffering, take the easy route are there in him until the end! But His love and truth and integrity win the victory over them, for all of us! We are redeemed - because He is Human!

- **TODAY** We have begun Lent on Ash-Wednesday and on this First Sunday of **Lent** we join Jesus in the desert of struggle and encounter. Having been baptised in the Holy Spirit, filled with divine power for His Mission, he encounters the dark shadow side of the human condition that the Eternal Word of God lovingly embraces and becomes Flesh, becomes Human! And that struggle is with the inner demons of the false self - using Divine Power for self rather than for the other, serving self rather than the Kingdom. We can see no greater example of that temptation than in the crimes and scandal of child sexual abuse by clergy and religious and the clericalism that provides fertile soil for such self serving and self gratification to take place. Tempted as we are, Jesus is like us in all things, except sin! But He brings to our lives, the victory of Love, 'being for others', serving the Kingdom of God!
- We celebrate the Rite of Election with Molly to be baptised and confirmed and Beryl to be Received into Full Communion and confirmed at the Easter Vigil. Please pray for them and all journeying to Easter Sacraments during this sacred and renewing period of Lent.

If every tax payer signed a GiftAid form, the parish would benefit by about £3000 per year! ### THE TRUE FAST-ACCORDING TO POPE FRANCIS

"Fast from hurting words and say kind words. Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude. Fast from anger and be filled with patience. Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope. Fast from worries and trust in God. Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity. Fast from pressures and be prayerful. Fast from bitterness and fill your heart with joy. Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others. Fast from grudges and be reconciled. Fast from words and be silent - so you can listen."

WHY LENT? We enter this privileged time of personal and community renewal which we call Lent. We join with Christ Jesus' 40 Days in the desert to journey with Him through the desert of silence and prayer, of deprivation and hunger, of thirst and yearning. Why? To grow to become more like Jesus in generosity of spirit, openness of heart, deeper communion with God, a readiness to give of ourselves to the Mission of the Gospel. These 40 Days express our communion with all catechumens of the Church journeying to the great moment of Baptism (or reception into Full Communion with the Church; these 40 Days are our journey to the renewal of our Baptism at Easter when we say again our 'YES' to being plunged into the Mystery of Christ and become truly Christ People, filled with His Spirit and knowing ourselves to be 'Beloved of the Father'. Let us embrace these most precious days of renewal.

Stations of the Cross at 1.00pm on Sundays; An extra weekday Mass each week; Adoration of Christ in the Eucharist before or after Mass each day; Bible Alive to guide your prayer and Bible study; Volunteer to help others - at the Wild Goose (deep clean?), Borderlands, Children's Liturgy, Catechesis etc; Special effort for CAFOD ... but above all, Prayer, Love, Bring another to Christ and His Church, Give to the Poor, work for Justice, Care for the Planet!
