

CALLED TO BE A SHEPHERD -ME?

TODAY [1] The Fourth Sunday of Easter is 'Good Shepherd Sunday' celebrating Jesus our shepherd who lays down his life for us his 'flock' and yearns to gather all humanity into the experience of God's love and life. He laid down His life not just for the 'Christian Flock' but for every human person, and indeed all creation to bring all mercy and the fulness of God's life. Each one of us is called to be a shepherd to others, laying down our lives too!

[2] It is **Vocation Sunday** when we reflect on our particular calling in Christ deepening our sense of vocation in our work, our family, our marriage, our ministry, our political commitments - indeed the whole of our lives that are called and shaped by God in service of the world and the Kingdom's Coming. We pray also for a radical re-modelling of ordained ministry, to bring all 'clericalism' and priestly dominance to an end; and to open the Church to new expressions of ordained ministry (married as well as celibate, both women and men - all bringing their unique gifts and experience to ordained ministry, and enabling all God's people to be nourished with Jesus, Bread of Life and Cup of Love in the Eucharist available to all!

LITTLE SISTERS OF JESUS LEAD PRAYER DAY INSPIRED BY BL CHARLES DE FOUCAULD Another initiative as part of our Year of Prayer and our 170 Anniversary Year as a parish: on **Saturday 25th May the Little Sisters of Jesus** will lead us in a day of reflection upon the life, charism and witness of Bl little brother Charles de Foucauld. He lived his life among the most abandoned of peoples in the heart of the Sahara Desert, gave his life in love for Christ and the Muslim Toureg people among whom he lived and prayed. He spent hours each day in Adoration of Jesus in the Eucharist and never closed his door to the needs of the poor around him. His story has long inspired me personally in my life, prayer and ministry. The Day will begin at 10.00am and conclude at 4.00pm and will include a presentation of his life, teaching about his charism, time of Adoration of Jesus in the Eucharist and Mass - bring food to share for lunch.

CALLING ALL EU (European Union) CITIZENS - ALL WHO HAVE EU PASSPORTS

At a meeting in London this past week of Catholic Migrant Officers (and European national chaplains) from around England and Wales (sponsored by the Bishops' Conference), we examined the arrangements for all EU citizens (those holding EU passports, including their children born in UK) after 'Brexit'. Although clearly there is now doubt about 'Brexit', nevertheless it is vitally important that those concerned (which includes for instance people from Latin America holding Spanish passport and from Angola, East Timor etc holding Portuguese passports) understand the steps they need to take if they wish to remain in UK after 31st December 2020. It is relatively simple in most cases, but you must apply to the 'EU Settlement Scheme' from April 2019 and before end of June 2021. We are going to explore how our parish community can support our sisters and brothers in applying for Permanent Settled Status. Meanwhile, for more information visit: *www.gov.uk/eu-settled-status_*
