JESUS - LAW OR LOVE?

Does Jesus abolish the Law or fulfil the Law? Does His 'command' of Love without measure mean that we need not bother with Law anymore? Are the ideas of Law and Love contrary?

Jesus is a faithful Jew with huge reverence for the sacred 'Torah' or Law: for Him and the Jewish People Law is intended to be life-giving, not life-limiting. Yet Jesus does challenge us to live lives of such love that we go beyond the inevitable narrowness and restrictions of Law. Jesus replaces the young man's question 'What must I do?' with new question: 'How much can I do?'

The Law is fulfilled, but precisely by being transformed and transcended. Love is never limited by Law, but Love will never transgress the Law - a Law that genuinely comes from God's design and desire for His world. Law is limited - the Love that fulfils Law is without limit - infinite!

CALLING ALL EU (European Union) CITIZENS - ALL WHO HAVE EU PASSPORTS

All EU citizens (those holding EU passports, including their children born in UK), now that 'Brexit' has happened, must apply for residency in UK or there is a danger that if travelling abroad you might not be allowed re-entry to UK. It is vitally important that those concerned (including people from Latin America holding Spanish passport and from Angola, East Timor etc holding Portuguese passports) understand the steps they need to take if they wish to remain in UK after 31st December 2020. It is relatively simple in most cases, but you must apply to the 'EU Settlement Scheme' before end of June 2021. For more information visit: www.gov.uk/eu-settled-status

CONSECRATING ENGLAND TO MARY - 'Dowry Tour of Our Lady of Walsingham' During the Middle Ages (before the Reformation of the 16th century) England had such a deep devotion Mary that is was known as 'Mary's Dowry'. And the great Pilgrimage centre of Walsingham (dedicated to the 'Holy House of Nazareth') was one of the greatest Shrines in all Europe. The Bishops of England have decided to 'rededicate' England to Mary. As party of this the statue of Our Lady of Walsingham from the famous 'Slipper Chapel' is touring all the dioceses and a Consecration is being made in each Cathedral. The statue (with exhibi-

tion and three days of prayer and preaching) will be at Clifton Cathedral from Thursday 20th Feb (4.00pm) until Saturday 22nd (1.30pm). Please try to visit the Cathedral during these three days. I recommend especially 4.00pm to 7.30pm on Thursday 20th Feb - Bishop Declan will lead our diocesan Act of Consecration to Mary during Solemn Mass at 6.15pm Please see the poster in the porch for full details of the three day programme.
