

THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST



A NEW WORLD BEGINS, ALLELUIA!

Death is conquered - on the First Day of the week! The Day according to the Book of Genesis that God began creating the Universe. And God created a Paradise Garden where all was harmony ... UNTIL we sinned, we rebelled from our dignity as Children of God and began to destroy our world.

Now there is a New Garden - a Garden of Transformation - a Garden of Calvary death that becomes a Garden of Easter Resurrection. On the First Day of the Week! A New World has begun.

The Resurrection of Jesus is God's recreative, transformative Work, not just for His Son, the Word made Flesh, but for all the children of the earth, for all creation. Love has overcome hate, forgiveness has healed every wound, transformed humanity has overwhelmed our inhumanity, hope has replaced despair.

And we are Risen with Him - now not just after death. Already we are living the New Creation, touching our world with unconquerable love, bring true justice to the farthest islands, burning with a Light that no darkness can ever overcome!

TODAY: As we celebrate **New Life in Christ**, we pray for our catechumens, both adult and children, who were to be baptised today or next Sunday, but because of the Covid-19 restrictions this has had to be postponed. After the weeks of this extraordinary Lent, and the pain-filled journey through the Passion and Death of the Lord, we arrive at the Victory of Love over Hate, the Victory of Light over Darkness, the victory of Holiness over the Sin, the Victory of Life over Death - the Resurrection of Our Lord and Brother Jesus Christ.

NEXT SUNDAY: [1] **'Low Sunday'**, the Octave Day of Easter: we celebrate the wonder of this Feast of Feasts throughout the week. In the early Church this was the only other day that Baptism was celebrated - an overflow if there were too many to be baptised during the Vigil itself. Sadly, we are unable to celebrate Baptism (except in emergency) until the Coronavirus restrictions are lifted.

[2] The Word of God speaks to us of that **first Christian Community in Jerusalem that was so close and loving** that its life together that 'great signs and wonders were worked among them' and healing flowed from them into their city. They witnessed to the Risen Lord, the source of New Life! They were a community overflowing with healing and life empowering the witness of Peter and the other Apostles. The conversion of St Thomas from his doubt to profound faith came about because he returned to the Community of the Resurrection and discovered Jesus alive in the midst of them! Does this describe our parish, our Church?

[3] We celebrate **the Stations of the Resurrection at 6.00pm, streamed on Facebook.**

CORONAVIRUS EPIDEMIC - A CALL TO PRAYER AND CARE Please download from our parish website a copy of the prayers issued by our Bishops and use it daily in your own homes - support the sick, all medical staff caring for them, those caring in our nursing and elderly people's homes and countries without our sophisticated health service. Let us all care for the vulnerable in our neighbourhoods, especially all self-isolating? *Prayer and Care.*

FOODBANK - URGENT REQUEST We have had a very significant increase in demand for our Parish Foodbank since the Emergency - we are one of the few Foodbanks still open! We are supplying food to 80-100 people each day, as well as delivering food to some families. **THANK YOU TO THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN ABLE (VERY GENEROUSLY) TO PROVIDE DONATIONS OF FOOD OR MONEY.** We will still need for some time to come supplies of *EVERYTHING - primarily non-perishable foods and drinks in tins and packets.* What kind of things? Long-life milk and juices, small jars of coffee, tins of meat, fish, vegetables, tinned tomatoes baked beans, soups, custard and fruit; packets of rice, pasta, cereals and biscuits; jars of pasta sauce, ketchup, mayonaise, packet soups; toilet rolls, bars of soap, toothpaste, and other toiletries. *You are helping us to meet a vital need, making practical in these difficult times 'love of our neighbour' and 'God's Option for the Poor'.* *Please be as generous as you can. Thank you in the name of all whom we are serving.*
