### FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT - 'LAETARE/REJOICING' SUNDAY



#### ***JESUS - LIGHT OF THE WORLD!***

We journey to the Pool of Baptism throughout Lent - journey to cleansing waters, to healing waters, to life-giving waters, to waters that bring us 'enlightenment'. Many of the Churches of Eastern Tradition still call Baptism 'the Enlightenment'. That is why the baptised person is given a baptismal candle lit from the Easter Candle of the Resurrection Light! For by living deeply our Baptism ('living deeply our new life') we are bearers of Jesus' light into a world darkened by inhumanity, brutality, war and poverty.

Lent is a journey into the Light of Easter: and this Light of the Gospel Light of the Spirit, Light of Christ will challenge all the dark places that lurk in our hearts. To be 'enlightened' is to be challenged to change, to be honest, to allow self-reality to dawn: for only the 'truth sets us free'. Light will always convert us not only into more self-awareness and self-honesty, the only path to holiness, but also will convert us into more 'otherness': our lives will become a gift to others, a light that will guide another to the Waters of New Life and Hope of Freedom. Let us too go to the Pool this Easter.

**TODAY** [1] On the **Fourth Sunday of Lent** (also called 'Laetare' or 'Rejoicing' Sunday), we celebrate Jesus the Light who enlightens his people, removing our blindness to the wonder and beauty of God and of each other. Baptism bring us into the Light so that we can begin see with God's eyes, live with God's Life and love with God's Heart that the Spirit creates in us. During Lent we seek to recognise our blindness and welcome the Light into all our inner darkness as we prepare for the Renewal of Easter commitment to live our baptism - to walk as 'Children of the Light' and bring the Light of God's loving to our world. That Light that overcomes all darkness is the source of our joy!

[2] **Mothers Sunday** is also celebrated on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. This past week also saw International Women's Day - so we honour both the gift of our mothers (both living and deceased) and the struggles of women around the world for equality, freedom and justice. Some of the women of our parish family will help us celebrate both motherhood and womanhood during our Mass of this Rejoicing Sunday.

**NEXT SUNDAY** [1] The **Fifth Sunday of Lent** celebrates Jesus, the Resurrection and the Life. In the calling Lazarus back into life we glimpse something of the wonder of the Christ's Resurrection. He calls our name also so that we will leave the dark tombs of sinfulness - both personal and structural - so that we, in the power of His 'indestructible life', will unbind our world from poverty and discrimination, war and violence and set free our sisters and brothers from the dehumanisation that traps them in dark tombs of oppression.

[2] We celebrate the **Rite of Child Catechumen** with children and families preparing for Baptism at Easter - please pray for them.

**FIRST EUCHARIST PROGRAMME 2021 BEGINS** Now our children have returned to teaching in school, we can begin the First Eucharist Preparation Programme for 2021. The start has been delayed because of Covid restrictions, but at last we can begin. Letters with a reply form are being distributed in the parish, the school and on the Parish Website this week. Please return the reply form to the Presbytery or the School by Monday 22nd March. There will be a first meeting for Parents who wish their child to be prepared for First Eucharist in 2021 on Thursday 25th March at 4.30pm (on Zoom), and the Programme begins for both children and parents on Thursday 8th April at 4.00pm. The First Eucharist Sunday will be on 18th July at 10am Mass.

**REFURBISHMENT OF THE ASSISI CENTRE (Ground Floor) BEGINS** For something like three years now we have been fund-raising and planning for the refurbishment of the ground floor of the Assisi Centre, to make it more 'fit for purpose' to help develop the expanding ministry of the Parish and our Borderlands charity. At last we can begin the work! It commences on Monday 22nd March when contractors come on site and will continue for at least 14 weeks. It will mean some disruption. The Parish office will temporarily move to the 'New Room' where normally we have the Children's liturgy of the Word (next to the main Lawfords Gate entrance); the Sacristy will move temporarily to first 'side room' off the church where the 'Reconciliation Room' (or Confessional) is sited.

**What is being done?** A new entrance to the Assisi Centre (with disabled accessibility ramp) will be constructed near the Church doors; a small waiting area near the parish office and two new toilets installed; a new and larger ground floor kitchen (with the sacristy being made a little smaller); a folding dividing wall in the Romero Room to increase more flexible use for smaller groups; better IT facilities fitted (including TV screens for teaching purposes). The old doorway to the former presbytery will be blocked off.

**COVID VACCINE PROPOSED AVAILABILITY AFTER MASS AT ST NICKS** I have been approached by a local doctor and health centre with a view to increasing the take up of the Covid Vaccine among our BAME community. It is proposed that someone from the Health Centre will talk with us at a Sunday Mass and then arrangements will be made for a mobile vaccination Unit to come to St Nicks so that people can be vaccinated after Mass on a subsequent Sunday. I want to encourage everyone to be vaccinated both for their own (and their family's) safety and health, but also for the protection of the whole community.

**YEAR OF ST JOSEPH - FEAST OF ST JOSEPH** 150 years ago Pope Pius IX declared St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church (St Nicholas of Tolentino was regarded in this role for many centuries before). Pope Francis, to celebrate the anniversary, has appointed 2021 as **the Year of St Joseph**. Francis highlights Joseph as a role model as 'a beloved, tender father ... one who welcomes the will of God ... a creatively, courageous father, example of love ... a father who teaches the value, dignity and joy of work .. a father "in the shadows" centred on Mary and Jesus ... a man of prayer.' **LET US ON FRIDAY 19TH MARCH AT 6.30PM COME TOGETHER TO CELEBRATE THE FEAST OF ST JOSEPH WITH MASS (also live-streamed on the Parish Website).** Highlights of Pope Francis's teaching on St Joseph (together with a prayer) can be downloaded from the parish Website (Home Page).
