## FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER ('GOOD SHEPHERD')



### *Which am I? Shepherd or sheep?*

Am I called to be a shepherd or a sheep? a leader or a follower? A pastor or one who is pastored? Well if we look at Jesus, 'the Great Shepherd of the sheep', he was pointed out to be 'the Lamb of God', innocent and led to the slaughter! Every shepherd must allow him or herself to be shepherded: cared for, held, gathered, guided. Every 'sheep' must be ready to hold, listen, guide, and gather to the Lord. We are all called to be both - as Jesus, the Good Shepherd, shows us.

We all need a guide who lead us to good pasture, to share the rich food of God's truth and love so as to be nourished. And we all have a gift to nourish another, or our community, in truth and love. In today's Church we all share the responsibility of being shepherds and we all need to be guided by listening to each other, whether we are Pope, bishop, priest, deacon or parishioner. Sadly there is a strong trend to 'protect' the priesthood by 'upping' its status and separating it off - like in the old days. This is a loss of faith in the Holy Spirit who speaks through the whole People of God as St John Henry Newman taught us so well. Only a listening Church can be a teaching church: those with authority to teach can only do so if they have the humility to learn from those they teach!

**TODAY** [1] **The Fourth Sunday of Easter** celebrates Jesus the Good Shepherd, who lays down His life to bring us the fullness of life - the Lamb of God led to the slaughter of the Cross who is raised to Resurrection Life to become the 'Great Shepherd of the Sheep'. As disciples of the Shepherd, what do we sacrifice in order to give life to others, to be shepherds to the broken, hurting and victimised of our world?

[2] It is '**Vocations Sunday**', a day to pray not only for vocations to ordained ministry and religious life, but also and indeed primarily that each of us will listen to God's call in our lives and seek to respond to that unique call more fully. We also pray that the Church will truly listen to the Holy Spirit who calls women as well as men to leadership and ordained ministry, but these calls are not being affirmed and 'obeyed' - and the integrity of the Church and our proclamation of the Gospel is thereby harmed. We also need to pray for a 'remodelling', 'reshaping' or ordained ministry in the Church - getting away from a male clerical dominated Church. Then we shall become the Church of the 'Good Shepherd'!

**NEXT SUNDAY** [1] **The Fifth Sunday of Easter** calls the Church to celebrate Jesus the Vine of Whom we are the Branches. The New Testament offers us many models of the Church - many like Jesus the Vine and Branches speak of dynamic growth, constant change and fruitfulness that is ever new! They also speak of 'unbreakable bonds of love and unity' - the Holy Spirit that binds us together in Christ so that we are one Body, we are as a community, Christ given to today's world. Let us be such a Church bearing the fruit of Jesus' Love!

The flexibility our seating and the lay-out of our church is being used to the full! ***IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT PARENTS ENSURE THEIR CHILDREN DO NOT MISS ANY OF THE SESSIONS (except for ill-health of course!)***

***THESE PARENTS MEETINGS ARE ESSENTIAL TO THE PROGRAMME OF PREPARATION FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES JOURNEYING TO FIRST EUCHARIST.***

**TALKING AND LISTENING GROUP** - the group runs every Tuesday from 4.00pm to 5.30pm and offers a safe place for people to come and talk about the issues which are affecting them and listen to others. **PARISH FORUM - LET YOUR VOICE BE HEARD!** Because of Covid restrictions it is over a year since our last Parish Forum. **What is the 'Parish Forum'?** It is a gathering open to everyone in the our parish community - **EVERYONE** is invited! You are invited to come and speak your voice, raise your questions, bring you ideas and contribute to and guide the future development of our parish community. Everyone's voice is important. We might not all agree on everything, but everyone's voice needs to be heard so that we can discern or 'distill' what the Holy Spirit is saying to our parish community - where the Spirit is leading us and how the Spirit wants to empower each of us and lead us as a community into God's future and vision for us. ***Our next Parish Forum is on Saturday 15th May at 5.00pm on Zoom (ie on-line through the internet). There will be time spent in small groups (called 'rooms' in Zoom language!) as well as all together.*** It will be led by members of our Parish pastoral Council and will help set the Agenda for the future development of the parish.

**Why is the Parish Forum important?** As we come out of Covid restrictions it is very important to 'gather' our community again, to help us all rebuild our community and our relationships after this more than a year of isolation and apartness. It is important to plan how we can do this effectively and to hear how we have experienced this past Pandemic year. ***So please come and be part of this meeting. **GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY - Sunday 25th April - Day of Prayer for Vocations** We are asked to pray for a deepened sense of vocation in each of our lives and in our parish community. Each one of us has a unique vocation from God; each of us is called to proclaim the Good News and serve the Kingdom of Justice, Love and Peace; each of us is called to care for our environment and seek to heal the abuse of our good Earth so that future generations will be able to thrive on this planet. Vocations to marriage, to ordained ministries and to the religious life are necessary to the mission of God's Church. We seek especially to call members of our community to the Permanent Diaconate, preparing for a future without a resident priest. **Sunday 25th April.** Pray also for new expressions of ordained ministry!

**MEN AND WOMEN EQUAL IN MINISTRY** There are many charisms and ministries in the Body of Christ - each one of us, young and old, male and female, lay and clergy, and whatever our gender identity - all of us are 'beloved children of the Father', each of us is gifted by the Holy Spirit to serve, to proclaim, to build the missionary Body of the Christ and to transform the world. In our parish we are moving towards a parish community led and served by predominantly lay ministry, served and supported by the ordained ministry of deacons and a part-time (non-resident) priest. We are committed as a parish to promote, empower and train many different forms of ministry. ***The ministry of women and men are equally valued, the ministry of lay people and ordained deacons and priest are equally valued.*** All of us over 40 years old have almost certainly grown up in a church that has neglected and minimised the ministries of lay people. We are still in a clergy (and therefore male) dominated church and this has caused major problems while being unfaithful to the New Testament. Some ministries are denied to women (and not just ordained ministries) ... therefore there is an urgent need to enable voices of women to be heard, their gifts to be recognised and their ministries to be released, for the good of the whole Church and its Mission and witness. This is to correct the imbalance and injustice that has been the norm for centuries. ***Please do not interpret this as diminishing or demeaning the ministries of our brothers. We are all called to work together for the Kingdom as equal partners in the Lord's work.***

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***WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE IN HOSPITAL:*** Can I remind everyone that when a Catholic goes into hospital, **the patient or their family MUST request a visit from the Catholic Chaplain** - data protection and confidentiality rules in hospitals prohibit the passing on of information to chaplaincies otherwise. The Chaplain will not know of your presence in hospital and cannot visit a patient without the patient's prior request and permission.

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
