

LOVER OF GOD, LOVER OF THE POOR

St Nicholas, lover of children, born like Samuel, Samson and John the Baptist of barren parents, the gift of God and his parents gift to God.

TODAY [1] We have the joy of celebrating the **PATRONAL FEAST OF ST NICHOLAS OF TOLENTINO WITH OUR MASS OF REDEDICATION**. This is made even more special as we emerge from Covid restrictions and seek to rebuild our community and its many ministries, activities and mission. We will bless the traditional St Nicholas Bread. **Let us rededicate ourselves to being the Body of Christ, a parish of many nations united in Christ, valuing each other's cultures, healing each other's wounds, reaching out to the poor and marginalised around us and throughout the world.**

[2] This Mass of Rededication to the mission of our parish must also include **our Mission to heal our Planet** in this **Season of Creation** listening to the cries of our Common Home, the Earth, and the cries of the poor! Hospitality of Heart is the theme - welcoming all Creation into our 'Home' as we recognise that Creation is God's Home shared with us!

[3] There will be a **Special CAFOD Emergency Retiring Collection** to support the work of CAFOD in Afghanistan, Haiti and Ethiopia/Tigray, South Sudan during their crises.

NEXT SUNDAY [1] On the **Twenty-Fourth Sunday of the Year** we celebrate Jesus, the Suffering Servant who is the 'Messiah', the Christ who liberates humanity through His sacrificial love. The Cross He embraces is His identification with the rejected and oppressed of our world - and He calls us, as His disciples, to the same identification and Servanthood, raising up the poorest by our committed action - translating our Faith into liberating action!

[2] This weekend the **'Root and Branch Synod'** takes place in Bristol and we support this important moment and grace of God for the People of God with our prayer, our compassionate and generous listening to many voices that are often not heard by many in the Church.

[3] With our children and young people back at school and college, and with many preparing to begin or continue at University, we hold the **Day of Prayer for the Church's Mission in Education**.

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POPE FRANCIS ON HEALING THE PLANET 'Laudato si, o' mi Signore' (Praise be to you, my Lord). In the words of this beautiful canticle, St Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us : 'Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruits with coloured flowers and herbs'. This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of all with which God has endowed her. We have come to see ourselves as her lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will. This is why the earth herself, burdened and laid waste, is among the most maltreated of our poor; she 'groans in travail'

CAFOD RESPONDING TO MULTIPLE CRISES ACROSS THE WORLD

[1] CAFOD is responding to significant crises across the world this week. We are working with local Church organisations in **Haiti** to deliver emergency aid to people affected by the catastrophic earthquake and tropical storm. In the tragic situation in **Afghanistan**, we are working to ensure the safety of our local partners and their communities. We are supporting local aid workers to deliver urgent food and water supplies to hundreds of thousands of people facing extreme hunger in **Tigray in Ethiopia, South Sudan and north-east Nigeria**. [2] Thanks to your donations, CAFOD has been helping people in **Syria** since the crisis began 10 years ago. Over 12 million people have left their homes, 5.6 million are refugees in neighbouring countries and within Syria, 13 million people need help. At the beginning, our focus was on delivering food and blankets through our local church partners. Then we started providing education, health and legal services, and helping people earn a living. Our latest projects are supporting children, lonely elderly people, helping women learn to read, and helping people restart their small businesses. None of this work would have been possible without your support of CAFOD. Thank you.

URGENT APPEAL FOR BAME BLOOD DONORS The NHS has issued an urgent call for more Black people to give blood to meet increasing demand for Black African, Black Caribbean or mixed ethnicity donors. Some 16,000 new donors from these ethnic groups must be recruited this year as demand rises for life-saving transfusions for people with sickle cell disease, according to the health service. Sickle cell is the fastest growing genetic disorder in the UK, affecting 15,000 people with around 300 babies born with the blood disorder each year; the illness can cause organ failure, stroke or loss of vision, sometimes even leading to death. The disorder is more common in Black people and, as such, people from this ethnic group are more likely to have the rare blood sub-group Ro that many Black sickle cell patients need. The Church strongly encourages blood donation as a life-saving gift to others. **PLEASE CONSIDER BECOMING A BLOOD DONOR - ONE PINT OF BLOOD CAN SAVE UP TO THREE LIVES! PLEASE PRAY WITH URGENCY FOR THE PEOPLE OF AFGHANISTAN We are expecting in Bristol a sudden increase in the number of Afghan families and individuals (including unaccompanied child refugees). There is such fear in Afghanistan - please pray!
