

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT- Year C (St Luke)



'COME, LORD JESUS, COME!'

For sure He is coming! He came hidden in poverty and obscurity, recognised only by some poor shepherds, some wandering wise ones and some doubtful apostles.

He comes today, now, also hidden in the poverty of bread and wine, in the frailty of our brothers and sisters in hurting humanity, in the gentleness of a friend's touch.

He will come no longer hidden, but with glory blazoned across all creation (the truth hidden behind words like 'riding on the clouds of heaven'). How will he come because creation is fulfilled and finally fully evolved into the wonder of Christ Omega. He will come because we have worked to transform our world into a place of justice, of goodness, of truth, of humanity - and therefore a place of the Divine, the Kingdom. May our lives serve the ancient cry of the Christian's heart - Come Lord Jesus!

TODAY [1] We begin once more the Church's Liturgical Year, with the **First Sunday of Advent, Year C (The Year of Luke's Gospel)**. We celebrate that Jesus will come again in the Glory of the Universe transformed in Love, all creation gathered into the Body of Christ. The Church's mission is to bring the 'Cosmic Love of Christ' (Pope Francis - 'Laudato si') to the world and all our fellow creatures, to all systems that shape (or deform) our beautiful 'Common Home'. We are to be alert to every opportunity to change our world and build a new future, towards the Final Coming of Christ in our Glorious Cosmos!

[2] On this day of 'New Beginnings and New Future', we have the joy of **welcoming two new adult Catechumens**, Neil and Joanna.

[3] Today is **Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees** around the world. There are globally 68 million refugees and displaced people who have fled their homes because of war, oppression, poverty or Climate Change. God says repeatedly in the Bible - welcome and care for the 'Stranger among you', whereas our government and most of Europe are adopting a policy of 'Hostile Environment' seeking to deter them coming. How can we change hearts and break down walls & barbed wire fences in order to obey God's Word - 'Welcome them!'

NEXT SUNDAY [1] On the **First Sunday of Advent** we celebrate that the Day of Christ, when we and all creation are transfigured in the Glory of Divine Love, will most surely come. Our Mission is to bring that Divine Love into our world and its systems, eradicate oppression, inequality and injustice, and so truly witness to the Good News and hasten the Day of Christ, the Day of Creation's fulfilment in Christ.

[2] The Churches in UK celebrate '**Bible Sunday**', delighting in the rich food of the 'Bread of the Word' we find in our Christian Scriptures. The Bible is our first and greatest prayer book, source of wisdom, God's long love song to His People, to all the People of the World. Let us savour with delight this richest of food!

THE YEAR OF LUKE With a new Liturgical Year (Sundays Year C) nearly all the Sunday Gospel will be taken from Luke's Gospel. Luke, a disciple of St Paul, expresses especially the Gospel as Paul preached it to the Gentile (non-Jewish) world: a Gospel that was Good News to the Poor, a Gospel of Mercy and Forgiveness, a Gospel filled with the Holy Spirit and Hope, a Gospel of Joy, a Gospel of equality for women - a Gospel for our Age!

ADVENT - THE VISION OF MISSION Advent is a time for 'people with far-seeing eyes' - awakened to the reality of our world, ready to listen and to gaze: in order to recognise where, when and how Jesus comes in the 21st century (in the poverty, among the oppressed, disguised as an addict or as homeless, crying out for acceptance and freedom in the asylum-seeker, yearning for peace among the women and children who are the greatest victims of our wars). But you have to have courage to see and to hear - and more courage to speak and to act! The Spirit of God unfolds a vision of Mission - to transform the deserts and wastelands of our world into places of hope, rich and fertile in humanity and justice, healing and freedom. Our Mission is world-challenging and world-changing. Let our worship empower our mission, as we gaze upon bread from the fields and wine from the hills being transformed utterly in Christ by the Spirit and the Word through the ministry of the Church!

POPE FRANCIS CALLS US ALL TO THE TWO YEAR GLOBAL 'SYNOD' This is one of the most important moments in the history of the Modern Church, as Pope Francis challenges us all to take part in the Two Year Global Synod to serve the renewal and the reform of the church in our time. For the first time since the early Church, all God's People are called to speak their voice and help shape decisions that will affect the whole Church and its future development. That this process began on the Feast of St

A number of people representative of our diverse communities are being approached to gather groups together to listen to one another, speak their voices, journey together. There will be an information session with these group facilitators to guide them in this. The 'voices' from all the groups will be gathered together by the end of January and there will be a 'Full Parish Assembly' to explore this and formulate our parish contribution to the Diocese and the Global Church. ***I cannot emphasise too much how important this process is for the future of our parish, our diocese and the whole Church. While watching live-streamed Mass helps us when we are truly unable to come to mass (because of essential work or caring for the sick or our vulnerability to illness or because of age and frailty), **it must not become an easy alternative to coming together and sharing together as a community of Mission the Living Word and the Body and Blood of Christ in the Mass.** Now is the time to return to Mass in church unless serious issues prevent us.
