

THIRTY-SECOND WEEK OF THE YEAR- World Day of the Poor



WHO ARE THE GENEROUS ONES?

Jesus is constantly turning the world's way of looking at things, the world's priorities, upside down. When we are geared to be 'upwardly mobile', He calls us to be like Him, 'downwardly mobile', entering the world of the poor, the marginalised and the forsaken. He challenges our success culture with His culture of vulnerable loving. Instead of climbing the ladder, He calls us to be ambitious for love ... to let love permeate all we do, all we say, all we are. It is not about how generous we are with our money, but how generous we are with our hearts!

So the wealthy put large sums (their plentiful 'left-overs') into the "Temple Treasury", and people were impressed. The poverty stricken widow put a small coin - all she had - into the same box. So who sacrificed for God? Who was truly generous of heart? God sees into the heart. Whatever we give - large or small - let it flow from a New Heart, like unto His, a sacrificial heart, a heart alive and full of love. Jesus, let us see with Your eyes and love with Your Heart, alongside the poorest.

TODAY [1] Yet again we celebrate 'God's Option for the Poor' made flesh in Jesus on the **Thirty-First Sunday of the Year**. Jesus in front of his disciples sees through the hypocrisy of rich and wealthy believers making a great show of their big giving to the temple (or church!) and invites us to see the greatness of the small gifts that the poor more generously give. Jesus sees to the heart, and is not impressed quantity, but by quality of heart.

[2] As the **COP26 Climate Conference** is in session in Glasgow, we support by our prayer (bearing fruit in action), by celebrating a '**Mass of Creation**' at 10.00am

[3] Appropriately, it is also **World day of the Poor**, when the Catholic Church focusses on our fundamental Mission to be 'Good news to the Poor'. Our beautiful planet, so abused and wounded, is as Pope Francis comments among the most poor and abused of our world today - so we (with renewed commitment) 'listen to the cries of our Common Home, listen to the cries of the Poor' ... AND ACT...NOW!

[4] Our **10am mass will also be Signed for the Hearing Impaired**.

NEXT SUNDAY [1] The **Thirty-Third Sunday of the Year** is also **Remembrance Sunday**. We celebrate that because of Jesus dying and rising, death never has the last word, and war will one day be vanquished. Our 'Remembering' must enable us to 'see the signs of the times' and hear the groans of our Common Home and the peoples and land devastated by war, violence and destruction. It is time to build a robust Peace, a Peace with each other, a peace among nations, a peace built on justice for all, a peace built on equality, a peace that embraces the Earth itself. Creation cries out for us to stop making war on 'Mother Earth'

[2] On this **Remembrance Sunday** we will celebrate a Mass for Peace at 10.00am

POPE FRANCIS CALLS US ALL TO THE TWO YEAR GLOBAL 'SYNOD' This is one of the most important moments in the history of the Modern Church, as Pope Francis challenges us all to take part in the Two Year Global Synod to serve the renewal and the reform of the church in our time. For the first time since the early Church, all God's People are called to speak their voice and help shape decisions that will affect the whole Church and its future development. That this process began on the Feast of St John Henry Newman is significant, for with prophetic vision and open mind and heart he wrote famously 'On Consulting the Laity on Matters of Doctrine'. **WE ARE ALL CALLED TO BE INVOLVED AND HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO SPEAK OUR VOICES.** Please use often the Parish Synod Prayer which is on our parish website.

POPE FRANCIS WRITES: "Breakthrough comes about as a gift of dialogue, when people trust each other and humbly seek the good together, and are willing to learn from each another in a mutual exchange of gifts. This is an 'overflow' of love, breaking the banks that confined our thinking and causes to pour forth answers that formerly we could not see. As Pope I want to encourage such 'overflows' by reinvigorating the ancient practice of 'Synod'. The term comes from Greek and means 'walking together' and its goal is to recognise, honour, and reconcile differences on a higher plane where the best of each can be retained: differences are expressed and polished until you reach, if not consensus, a harmony that holds all together. Therein lies its beauty: the harmony that results can be complex, rich and unexpected. In the Church the One who brings about harmony is the Holy Spirit."

UPDATE ON THE SYNOD IN OUR PARISH Our Parish Pastoral Council met this week to lay plans for our participation in this hugely important process of listening and discerning 'what the Spirit is saying to the Church today'. A number of people representative of our diverse communities are being approached to gather groups together to listen to one another, speak their voices, journey together. There will be an information session with these group

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facilitators to guide them in this. The 'voices' from all the groups will be gathered together by the end of January and there will be a 'Full Parish Assembly' to explore this and formulate our parish contribution to the Diocese and the Global Church. ***I cannot emphasise too much how important this process is for the future of our parish, our diocese and the whole Church. PLEASE PLEASE take part generously.*** Further information soon.
