

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT- Year ('Gaudete' Sunday)



Dance for Joy for you are baptised in the Spirit!

Anthropologists tell us that the origin of dance is worship - dancing for joy as a sacrifice of praise to God! You can be forgiven for not recognising that looking at some western dancing!!

David danced before the Ark of the Covenant as it was brought into his capital city of Jerusalem. BISHOPS NEW GUIDANCE: WORSHIP FOR THE RENEWED COVID MEASURES

The Bishops of England and Wales have written to all parishes:

Practical Guidance for Churches

- With respect to the current situation with the Omicron variant it is important to ensure the following points are followed in our churches:
- [1] That people displaying any symptoms of covid-19 should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person.
- [2] That hand sanitiser is available to those attending the Church.
- [3] Face coverings must be worn by those attending public acts of worship unless there is a genuine exemption or the person is leading worship or participating in a role that requires the mask to be removed for a period of time.
- [4] That there is **good ventilation and air throughput in the building**; in this case, because of climatic conditions, it would be important to remind people to wrap up well in church!
- [5] There is now very strong evidence to support that the main mode of this variant's viral transmission is through aerosols, and that the risk from surface and touch transmission is very small indeed. As such, the strict regimes of church cleaning that were recommended at the beginning of the opening of churches for public worship are no longer necessary. General church cleaning is sufficient.
- [6] That a positive message encouraging people to get vaccinated and have the booster jab when able is delivered whenever possible (bearing in mind that the 40+ age group can apply for the booster vaccination, and that the period between 2nd dose and booster is reduced to 12 weeks).
- [7] That people who are engaged in a form of pastoral ministry which involves ministry to the housebound, sick and vulnerable, **should take regular lateral flow tests** to ensure they are safe to do so. These are free from the NHS.

<u>POPE FRANCIS CALLS US ALL TO THE TWO YEAR GLOBAL 'SYNOD'</u> This is one of the most important moments in the history of the Modern Church, as Pope Francis challenges us all to take part in the Two Year Global Synod to serve the renewal and the reform of the church in our time. For the first time since the early Church, all God's People are called to speak their voice and help shape decisions that will affect the

whole Church and its future development. That this process began on the Feast of St John Henry Newman is significant, for with prophetic vision and open mind and heart he wrote famously 'On Consulting the Laity on Matters of Doctrine'. WE ARE ALL CALLED TO BE INVOLVED AND HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO SPEAK OUR VOICES. Please use often the Parish Synod Prayer which is on our parish website.

<u>UPDATE ON THE SYNOD IN OUR PARISH</u> The Parish Pastoral Council ask all those who have agreed to be act as facilitators of the various 'Synod Groups', to gather their groups and arrange for them to meet as soon as possible. We have to submit our findings to the Diocese by mid February. We realise that the latest renewed government Covid restrictions will mean that most groups are likely to be on Zoom or some other IT platform, and while this is not the best way to conduct the Synod, we need to do all we can to make it work well. If you need assistance in setting up a Zoom meeting for your group, please contact the parish office.

TRAINING NEW ALTAR SERVERS There will be a pre-Christmas practice for **ALL ALTAR SERVERS** (new and old!) on **Saturday 18th December at 10.15am (prompt)**. The training will last approximately one hour. It is hoped that our newly trained Altar Servers will serve on Sunday 19th Dec for the first time.

JOURNEY OF FAITH Because of the renewed Covid Restrictions, the Journey of Faith Group have decided to meet on Zoom until Government Guidance changes - each Friday at 6.00pm.
