SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER



The Best Communication is ... Communion-

Our world loves programmes, projects, initiatives. A new technique will deliver effective evangelisation! Let's find novel new ways to spread the message! As so often, this is partly true, but only a half-truth.

Look at the illustration here: what do you see? Individual people gathering together in close relationship becoming the Cross of Christ lifted high for the world to see! The real key to evangelisation today is the same as it was in Jesus' non-techno world - 'Love one another as I have loved you ... By the love you have for one another will all know you are my disciples ... Father may they all be so completely one that the world will believe'.

Yes we need to use every modern technique of communication, social media, internet, TV etc - they are all the gift of God! But without love it is all empty noise and seductive addictions! Only love evangelises, only love draws people to glimpse the new humanity that fulfils human longing; only love can change the human heart, change our world. Love alone can conquer everything. So Jesus prays for the unity of His disciples. Loving unity is the secret of effective mission and witness. Come Spirit!

TODAY: [1] With the **Seventh Sunday of Easter** we celebrate Jesus who unites us to Himself, to His Father and to one another in the unbreakable bonds of Love and Unity that His Spirit draws us into. Jesus prays, the night before He died for us, that all future generations of Christians would be united in love and faith, united in mission to our world. Sadly the Church has never fully lived out His prayer, never fully lived this Unity that is essential to our witness to the God of Jesus Christ before all the world. Let us heal our Church!

[2] Our mass is also a **Memorial of our sister Faustina Ogbu** who died two years ago of Covid at a time when we could not all share a proper funeral for her. There will be prayers at her graveside after the Mass and a reception at the Greek Orthodox Community Hall by Junction 3 - all are welcome.

NEXT SUNDAY: [1] We celebrate the second greatest Feast in the Church' calendar - **the Feast of Pentecost** - the birth of the Church in the ferment of divine energy pictured as a mighty wind and the fire of love. Faithful to His promise, Jesus on returning to His Father pours out the Spirit of their love into our hearts and upon our world - to gift and empower us to fulfil the mission He entrusted to us on Ascension Day. Because of Pentecost, we are equipped for mission and united in faith and love - we are His Body, the Church working with God to 'renew the face of the Earth'!

[2] We have the joy of receiving Tracey Anderson into Full Communion and Confirming her in the Holy Spirit at our 10.00am Mass. May we all open ourselves the constant new beginnings of the Holy Spirit

NOVENA TO THE HOLY SPIRIT This is the first and greatest Novena of Prayer in the Church's tradition, opening ourselves and the Church to the mighty wind of the Spirit - the energy for Mission; opening to the Living Water of the Spirit welling up to Life in all its fullness; opening to the Flame and Fire of God's Spirit that transforms us into flames of Divine Love in the heart of the world. Without the Spirit of God in us we can do nothing for God, without the Spirit of God we have no real life, without the Spirit of God we have no vision for our mission, no energy to serve the Gospel and the Kingdom. **COME HOLY SPIRIT!**

PENTECOST VIGIL MASS - SATURDAY AT 8.00pm For the greatest Feasts of the year, the Church holds a Vigil - as at Christmas with Midnight Mass, the Great Vigil of Easter, and **the Vigil invoking the Holy Spirit at Pentecost**. PENTECOST ON COLLEGE GREEN Sunday June 5th is both Pentecost Sunday, the Feast of the birth of the Church, but is also this year the occasion of the national celebration of the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II's accession to the British throne, 70 years ago. We mark and give thanks for 70 years of faithful and wise service of the peoples of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth. There will be a city wide celebration on College Green all day beginning about 12noon and concluding at 5.30pm. This will be followed at 6.30-8.00pm with Bristol-wide Churches gathering both to give thanks for our Queen and also to proclaim Pentecost and invoke the Holy Spirit upon our city. saying to us), the servant leadership of the members of the PPC is crucial. We are moving to an increasingly lay-led parish served by a non-resident priest (likely to be Richard after his 'semi-retirement' in 2-3 years time). The role of the PPC has become crucially important, giving leadership, ensuring Pastoral Care and Mission outreach, and enabling the liturgical and spiritual life of the parish. It is not about status, but about generous service. Those nominated for election to the PPC need to have commitment to this vision and capacity to foster it. Nomination papers will be distributed today. **Each parishioner (including young people who have been confirmed) can nominate up to three people.** But the nomination paper has to be countersigned by the person you wish to nominate - expressing their agreement. All Nominations need to be given into the Presbytery or the Parish office by Sunday 12th June. Voting will take place on Sunday at Mass on 26th June, but people who cannot be at Mass that day can ask for an early vote. Thank you.

Special Youth Pilgrimage to Lisbon 31 July to 8 August 2023

World Youth Day will next take place in Lisbon in 2023. The Diocesan Department for Adult Education and Evangelisation is organising an eight-day pilgrimage from July 31 to August 8, 2023 for young adults [18-35] in our diocese. The provisional plan is to spend six nights in Lisbon and two nights in Fatima. There will be formation sessions for the group before the pilgrimage to build community and support one another in our faith journey.
