FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT



JESUS - TEMPTED LIKE US!

Trouble is, we just find it hard to believe in the Incarnation - that God became really and totally human in Jesus! We always think of Him as Son of God in a way that obliterates his humanity! But Jesus is 'like us in all things but sin' - so he was tempted just like us - the difference being that the sinlessness One never gave in!

He goes into the wilderness we have made of the world by our sin, to challenge the 'Father of Lies', the false 'Angel of Light', the 'Destroyer'. Just as he was to 'descend into Hell' to liberate the captives - fallen humanity - so He goes into the wilderness to confront the darkness that is part of each of us, to conquer the dark powers of ambition and the abuse of power, to defeat the lust for popularity that too often overwhelms the desire for truth.
