RESURRECTION AND LIFE!

When Jesus called his first disciples, He said, 'Come and see' - see my life and discover new Life! Now shortly before His Passion, the people say to Jesus, 'Come and See' - not just the tomb of Lazarus, but come and see your coming death, by which we will receive your New

Jesus wept at the grave, wept for the death of his friend, wept with Martha and Mary in their bereavement - and also wept for His own coming suffering and death. We need the courage to help those we love who are dying to weep, to grieve, for their own deaths. Help speak of death for that will help them come to live their death well, to welcome 'sister death' with faith and courage, knowing death is the friend who ushers us into the fulness of our life and the final liberation of our love.

Already we live the Resurrection and the Life, already we have 'died with Christ that we might rise with Him'. That is why we can live with the Holy Spirit's courage, and die with the same courage and tranquillity. Let us 'come and see' behold the Cross and the Tomb that holds the beloved and gaze into the mystery of our eternity, our Life!

We are consulting the community on the proposals about the parish's future after Richard's retirement Autumn 2024 to be discussed with Bishop Declan when he meets the Parish Pastoral Council in May. Having given serious thought and prayer in the past week, please give your views. This is part of embedding the 'Parish in Synod' into the life and practice of our parish community and its decision-making.

Stations of the Cross (praying for all suffering poverty and famine both in UK

and globally) at 1.00pm (approx).

NEXT SUNDAY: [1] We begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. We greet the Lord as our Suffering Servant King and journey with Him from the 'triumph' of the joyous entry in Jerusalem with the cries of 'Hosanna' to the darkness of the mob shouting 'Crucify him' and leading Him to the Cross. Mass will start in the school playing field at 10.00am with the blessing of Palms and the Solemn Procession.

[2] There will not be Stations of the Cross, as we will have celebrated the suffering and

passion of Christ in the Mass (the Gospel being the Passion according to Matthew).
