

#### Glory! Humanity or God?

What is this Light that shines through Jesus upon the mountain? Is it the glory of God, for He is the son of God? Yet God's glory is experienced more the in the dark cloud that overshadows them as they are plunged into the dark mystery of god whose Light blinds us in its radiance!

Is it not rather the glory of God-touched humanity the New Humanity that Jesus comes to bring into the world to transform the course of history?
