TODAY: The Fourth Sunday of Easter celebrates the Risen Christ who is our Good Shepherd who leads into the eternal pastures of joy and Resurrection Life. He is the gateway to life in all its fulness. Let us listen to voice of the Shepherd as He leads us and all the Church during this time of Global Synod - leading us to new pastures, new ministries, a renewed sense of mission. We are called as the Body of our Shepherd Christ to be a Gateway of hope, healing and peace for humanity and indeed all creation. Are we ready to be a Shepherd community, to each other and to the wider community and world around us? Will we listen to His voice as He calls each one of us to the adventure of being missionary disciples? This is **Vocations Sunday**, praying as we do for a deepened sense of God's calling in each of our lives. Every one of of us has a particular vocation from God - let us listen to the 'whispers of the Spirit' in our heart. Each of us is called to proclaim the Good News and serve the Kingdom of Justice, Love and Peace; each of us is called to care for our environment and seek to heal the abuse of our good Earth so that future generations will be able to thrive on this planet. Vocations to marriage, to ordained ministries and to the religious life are necessary to the mission of God's Church. We seek to call members of our community to the many ministries of the Spirit (preparing for a future without a resident priest). Let us pray that through this Global Synod the Church will affirm, recognise and accept God's calling of both men and women to new forms of ordained ministry. We must tolerate no longer the Eucharist famine that the rules of the Church impose on most Catholics around the world. This is not being a 'Shepherd Church'!

In Hs Resurrection He is the victory of love over hate, of light over darkness, of life over death. He reveals the Way we should live, the Truth that liberates us and our authentic Life ... because He is the Love that creates the Universe!
