#### THE GOD BEYONDALL NAMES!

The One God Who is Three? Sounds absurd! A God Who is Lover, Beloved and the Love between? A God Who is Creator, Redeemer and Life Giver? A God Who is Life Giver, Pain Bearer, Love Maker? Never a God who is alone, lonely, isolated, but always a God who is community, relationship, Love!

How could God be love (and not just 'do' love?) without being a network of loving relationships, love's eternal energy flowing between Father whose existence is loving the Son, whose existence is being loved by the Father, and that shared love, that mutual eternal and infinitely creative gaze being the Holy Spirit - the breath of their Loving from before all time.

And we are created in their image and likeness to be whole and human only in relationship, in loving. We are incomplete without reaching out in love to the other, and to the Divine Other.

**DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE TO GLASTONBURY** On Sunday 9th July, Bishop Declan invites our whole diocesan family to join together for the annual Glastonbury Pilgrimage. In past years we have organised a parish coach - we would need to charge a realistic fare. We would leave after our 10.00am mass - leaving by 12noon. Bring a picnic lunch and water (in case the weather is hot!). We would return after the Pilgrimage Mass which is at 3.30pm (ie around 5.00pm). There is a full programme with opportunities for Adoration in the parish church, Sacrament of Reconciliation, Healing Prayer, the Rosary Procession and of course the Mass. I encourage our community to take part in this unique Diocesan Public Witness to our faith.

**NOTE ABOUT GLASTONBURY:** There are legends about Joseph of Arimathea visiting Glastonbury as well as St Paul preaching there (this latter is historically possible, though

very unlikely!). From the 6th century it has been a centre of devotion to Mary, the Mother of the Lord. There was founded a Celtic monastery from very early days which developed into the great Abbey whose ruins we see now. St Dunstan was abbot there and became a renowned Archbishop of Canterbury who composed the Coronation Service for the first King of England, much of which is still used in the Coronation of King Charles III we witnessed recently. With Henry VIII's break with the Catholic Church in the 16th century and the destruction of the nation's monasteries, the Torr saw the martyrdom of the Abbot, Prior and Sub-prior of the monastery for refusing to conform to the 'new religion'. It has been a centre for Pilgrimage both Catholic and Anglican for the past one hundred years.

<u>CHRISTIANS AT BRISTOL PRIDE - JULY 8th</u> In so many parts of the world our LGBTQ+ friends are experiencing increasing persecution, criminalisation and discrimination, so often promoted by Christian Churches, including many local Catholic Bishops despite the teaching and leadership of Pope Francis. It is therefore even more important that we Christians in UK offer an alternative witness ... one of inclusion, welcome and acceptance. As Bishop John Stowe of Lexington, USA preached recently:

"As you celebrate the annual Pride festival, know that I and many of the faithful of the Catholic Diocese of Lexington will be praying for you and with you at this time. I know that it has been a particularly hard year following the [State] legislative session with all its punitive measures against youth identifying as trans[gender]. I also know of the struggles that many of you experience personally and the rejection, meanness, misunderstanding and exclusion that you have too often experienced from communities of faith - including our own Catholic community. We all need to work to be more compassionate, understanding, civil, kind and willing to re-discover the universal fraternity that is God's plan. First and foremost, you are children of God. With that comes immense dignity and worth that cannot be taken away. During this time of [Pride Month] celebration, I hope that you will draw closer to the God of all creation and experience the all-embracing love manifest in Jesus."

I hope many of us will share in the Christians at Bristol Pride Service at 10.00am on Saturday 8th July at the New Rooms Wesley Chapel in Broadmead. There are other ways also to support and witness not only to the LGBTQ+ community here in Bristol, but also to Church and Society that value and support these our brothers, sisters, friends.
