CAFOD ASKS US TO SUPPORT SMALL SCALE FARMERS OVER SEEDS

Today and in the coming Sundays we have the opportunity to support CAFOD's campaign to challenge the World Bank's policy of depriving small scale farmers (the majority in Africa and Asia) from using and sharing their own seeds, rather being forced to buy expensive seeds from multi-national companies. The majority of the world's food is produced by these small scale farmers and they are also caring for our environment. GOD'S CALL TO SERVE THE LIFE AND MISSION OF YOUR PARISH It is very clear that our parish, together with all churches and voluntary organisations around the country, has not yet recovered fully from the effects of the Covid Pandemic and the restrictions placed upon our meeting together during that time. A significant number of our community are not coming to Mass here for a variety of reasons. It is a joy to welcome new families and individuals who have found their way to St Nicks. However there has been great difficulty in drawing members of the parish into being part of the many ministries and tasks of the parish. Whether it is the SVP, the welcoming Ministry, Church Cleaning, the Foodbank, Catechists, too few are doing too much in support of the parish's life and mission. We are all called by our baptism to serve and build the Church as a mission community. We are all called to sacrifice time and energy to build our parish community and supports the Mission of Christ entrusted to us. I realise only too well that many have heavy commitments caring for children or elderly family members and juggling work and family. They are indeed serving Christ in these ways. But I do ask everyone to reflect whether some time can be given to sustain the parish's life and mission as we move towards a lay-led parish. This will be a great challenge for all of us. Please pray about this urgent need in building the future of our unique parish.

ST NICK'S AND COMMITMENT TO 'SYNODALITY' We have played our part in contributing to the Church's world-wide 'Synod', as last year we gathered in different groups to listen to one another and share our thoughts and feelings about being part of the Catholic Church. The result was a 60 page report (which remains on our parish website for all to read) which we sent not only to our Bishop but also to those overseeing the Synod in the Vatican in Rome. But this is only the beginning! For the first time the 'International Synod of Bishops' in October in Rome will include 70 non-bishops (clergy, religious, lay men and lay women) with full voting rights. This is a very significant step forward - but there is a long way to go yet! But what is equally important is that your Parish Pastoral Council is committed to finding ways of embedding 'Synodality' in the life and 'governance' of our parish community - prayerful listening to one another in order to discern what the Spirit is saying to

us in our parish about the way forward into a future different from the past yet fully alive with Prayer, Community and Mission. The Synod's working document emphasises that those who experience being excluded from church life "are bearers of Good News that the whole community needs to hear" and that "whenever we encounter another person in love, we learn something new about God."

<u>SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION - RENEWAL FOR US ALL!</u> The Sacrament of Confirmation is the final step in 'Initiation' into the Body of Christ - the Holy Spirit coming to empower the Christian for ministry in the Body of Christ and mission to the world in the name of Christ. It is an essential part of our growing into Christ. Because of this the Western Church has separated Confirmation from Baptism for those baptised as children, celebrating it as part of our growing maturity in Christ and shouldering a more adult responsibility for the life and mission of the Church - serving the growth of the Kingdom. The Holy Spirit comes with charisms and gifts to equip us as co-workers with Jesus Christ in the immense and fulfilling task to building up God's Church in love, proclaiming the Gospel, the Good News, bringing healing and hope to the broken and oppressed, and ultimately 'renewing the face of the earth'!

<u>WOLUNTEER TRAINING IN THE FOODBANK</u> Our Foodbank will open 30 minutes later than usual all this week (ie at 10.30am) to enable training sessions for all volunteers. So from 9.30-10.30am on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, we will explore the ethos and values of this Christian Mission and the procedures required for us to work effectively and safely with respect for all come for help. SAFEGUARDING AND SOCIAL MEDIA
People love taking photos and short videos and often share them on Facebook, TikTok and other social media platforms. Some of these photos/videos are taken in the church or around it after Mass. However, Safeguarding demands that no-one's image can be so published without their permission. And this is especially important with regard to children (ie all under 18 years). Also no photos/videos can be taken during Mass, and nothing suggesting it is approved by St Nicks or placed on the Parish Facebook can be published without express permission of the Parish Priest or Parish Pastoral Council.

THE CRISES OF OUR TIME - A CALL TO URGENT ACTION!

This week we have witnessed two major events that must challenge our Christian conscience!

Firstly, the Passing of an immoral and internationally illegal Immigration Act in Parliament this week is traumatising even further so many of our refugee and asylum sisters and brothers. When there are so few legal paths for refugees to enter UK to detain and remove those who do manage to get here along dangerous journeys is contrary to all we believe as Christians. God in our Scriptures tells us to 'welcome the stranger', to treat them justly and with respect. This new Act does the opposite and needs to be opposed by all peaceful ways.

Secondly, we have witnessed the ravages of Climate Change in heatwaves and wild fires, together with drought. When will we wake up to our responsibility to make radical changes to our life-styles and force our governments to enact policies that are faithful to pledges made to reduce Global Warming to 1.5C. Our 'common home' our 'Mother Earth' is heading for catastrophic harm unless we act NOW! 'Lord, open our eyes to see, our ears to hear and our wills to act decisively and urgently!'
