Faith in the storms & turmoil

Faith is wonderful, beautiful - the days of calm and peace, when the sun shines and creation glows. But then the storms come - a bereavement, unemployment, fleeing from terror to a land that does not want you... Perhaps suffering for your faith or values, or your ethnicity, gender or orientation. And can God seem strangely silent, distant, disappearing in the dark clouds of pain and the heavy rain of disillusion and depression.

But Faith deepens as it confronts doubt; Faith is enlarged as it battles against the waves; Faith becomes more luminous as you walk the dark valley of tears. Maybe you feel you are sinking beneath the waves: but like Peter, keep your eyes fixed on Jesus and stretch out your hand - and he will be there even though you do not see or feel Him. That is real Faith - faith to walk on troubled waters and through the storm - Faith that gives Life! Faith that makes life worth living!

A foreign woman, a Canaanite, helps him discover that He is not simply the Jewish Messiah, but has a Universal Mission. He is the Sacrament, the Living Icon, of God's Universal Love. Are we truly His Body, the Church? Do we share His Universal Love where all really are welcome, all really do belong?

[2] As an expression of God's universal Love, we celebrate Mass with the LBGTQ+ community, families and friends at 3.00pm - and all we are welcome!

GOD'S CALL TO SERVE THE LIFE AND MISSION OF YOUR PARISH It is very clear that our parish, together with all churches and voluntary organisations around the country, has not yet recovered fully from the effects of the Covid Pandemic and the restrictions placed upon our meeting together during that time. A significant number of our community are not coming to Mass here for a variety of reasons. It is a joy to welcome new families and individuals who have found their way to St Nicks. However there has been great difficulty in drawing members of the parish into being part of the many ministries and tasks of the parish. Whether it is the SVP, the welcoming Ministry, Church Cleaning, the Foodbank, Catechists, too few are doing too much in support of the parish's life and mission. We are all called by our baptism to serve and build the Church as a mission community. We are all called to sacrifice time and energy to build our parish community and supports the Mission of Christ entrusted to us. I realise only too well that many have heavy commitments caring for children or

elderly family members and juggling work and family. They are indeed serving Christ in these ways. But I do ask everyone to reflect whether some time can be given to sustain the parish's life and mission as we move towards a lay-led parish. This will be a great challenge for all of us. Please pray about this urgent need in building our parish.

Borderlands was established by the parish as an independent Christian Charity in 2011, with Richard as its founding Chair. The time has come for him to step back from this role and so he has resigned as Chair and as a Trustee, but of course will continue to support and champion the excellent work of our refugee and asylum charity. He is delighted that a former parishioner, Kimberlee Carstensen, has been elected the new Chair of Borderlands. He is very confident that with her leadership and a gifted Board of Trustees, the Charity will go from strength to strength and develop greatly its life-giving work.

<u>CAROLINE PRICE TO MAKE VOWS</u> For some years Caroline was an Anglican Nun until she became a Roman Catholic. Since then she has sought to continue to live this vocation to the 'Religious Life' as a lay woman. Bishop Declan has agreed to receive her private Religious Vows at Mass in St James's Priory on August 26th at 2.00pm. All are welcome to share her joy that day by participating in the Mass.

<u>PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL UPDATE</u> [1] It was decided at last week's meeting that we needed to enlarge our PPC, as in this period of transition towards Richard's 'semi-retirement' the work and responsibility increases while some members capacity has lessened. So we seek nominations for 6 new Parish Pastoral Councillors no later than Sept 10th with Elections on Sept 24th.

[2] The PPC wants to embed a 'synodal' pattern of making decisions in the parish as well as re-building our community (post-Covid), and so will be contacting past conveners of 'synodal' groups (last January. February) to gather groups together once more.

POPE FRANCIS SENDS BLESSING TO THE WORK OF QUEST UK Our Dioces an Ministry among the LGBTQ+ community is linked with QUEST SW. Quest celebrated its 50th Anniversary this year and Pope Francis sent a message thanking Quest for its service of the LGBTQ+ community stressing that 'all are welcome' and valued in the Church. He also sent his blessing upon Quest's work and witness. Thank God for Pope Francis and Quest!
