

- All are invited to our **United Service for Christian Unity** at Parkway Methodist Church at 4.00pm let us embrace this call to worship together with our Christian sisters and brothers of other traditions, so that there can be healing of the divisions of centuries divisions that weakens our witness to the love of Christ and dims the light of Christ among us.
- **NEXT SUNDAY:** [1] With the **Fourth Sunday of Year B** we celebrate Jesus who challenges evil and seeks to liberate us and all humanity from the evil that dehumanises individuals, communities and our world. Not just 'evil spirits' (however we might interpret this in our modern world), but those structural evils that oppress, marginalise, discriminate against our sisters and brothers; and those evils that lead us to war instead of peace, poverty instead of a fair distribution of the world's resources; those evils that pollute our planet as well as our minds, and stop us acting urgently to heal our planet before it is too late. Will we challenge these same evils in the name and prophetic power of Jesus Christ?
- [2] We will mark Holocaust Memorial Day as well as pray for Peace in Gaza and the West Bank during our Mass. (Remember our stained glass window of Ss Maximilian Kolbe, Edith Stein and the Holocaust Martyrs at the Lady Chapel (to the right of our entrance).

GOD'S CALL TO SERVE THE LIFE AND MISSION OF YOUR PARISH. It is very clear that our parish, together with all churches and voluntary organisations around the country, has not yet recovered fully from the effects of the Covid Pandemic and the restrictions placed upon our meeting together during that time. A significant number of our community are not coming to Mass here for a variety of reasons. It is a joy to welcome new families and individuals who have found their way to St Nicks. However there has been great difficulty in drawing members of the parish into being part of the many ministries and tasks of the parish. Whether it is the SVP, the welcoming Ministry, Church Cleaning, the Foodbank, Catechists, too few are doing too much in support of the parish's life and mission. We are all called by our baptism to serve and build the Church as a mission community. We are all called to sacrifice time and energy to build our parish community and supports the Mission of Christ entrusted to us. I realise only too well that many have heavy commitments caring for children or elderly family members and juggling work and family. They are indeed serving Christ in these ways. But I do ask everyone to reflect whether some time can be given to sustain the parish's life and mission as we move towards a lay-led parish.

POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS ON DIVERSITY OF GIFTS, CHARISMS & MINISTRIES:

"The most beautiful experience is the discovery of all the different charisms and all the gifts of his Spirit that the Father showers on his Church! This must not be seen as a reason for confusion, for discomfort: they are all gifts that God gives to the Christian community, in order that it may grow in harmony, in the faith and in his love, as one body, the Body of Christ. The same Spirit who bestows this diversity of charisms unites the Church. It is always the same Spirit. Before this multitude of charisms, our heart, therefore, must open itself to joy and we must think: "What a beautiful thing! So many different gifts, because we are all God's children, all loved in a unique way". Never must these gifts become reasons for envy, or for division, for jealousy!"

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY - CIVIC EVENT You are invited to come and share in the annual Civic Event at Bristol City Hall on College Green on Friday 26th January 11.00am to 1.00pm (Registration from 10.30am). We will remember the horror of the Nazi Holocaust of the Jews of Europe when 6 million Jews and 1 million others perished in the death camps and at the hands of the roving Nazi Death Squads. We will also remember the too many genocides of the past 100 years, including Armenia, Cambodia, Rwanda and Bosnia. Since the terrible war between Israel and Palestine (Gaza) there has been an alarming increase in anti-Semitism. We must never allow criticism of Israeli government policy to descend into anti-Jewish sentiments and actions. So we will remember both the Israeli hostages and the devastating casualties of the destruction of Gaza.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL FEEDBACK The PPC this week discussed at length one topic - the future development of the parish with a servant-leadership team working with a non-resident priest (Fr Richard after September), the PPC and Finance Committee and all the parish community. The plan will be addressed over the coming weeks.
