FOURTH SUNDAY OF YEAR B - Racial Justice & Holocaust Memorial Sunday



With authority? Or Authoritarian? A challenge to the Church!

It is a crucial question for a Church that claims authority to teach and to guide - what is the nature and origin of Jesus' 'authority'? His only power - only authority - was the infinite love in His Heart, the utter Truth in His Word, the complete integrity of Action and Word in His Life. Never a shade of dominance or coercion. Truth and Love ever united, hand in hand. No silencing of those who speak troublesome truths!

He, the Lord of Lords, King of Kings, God in humanity, He lived, loved, spoke and acted as a friend among friends, a brother among sisters and brothers, offering Life. That is Jesus' power and authority - the Church must no more or less!

TODAY: [1] With the **Fourth Sunday of Year B** we celebrate Jesus who challenges evil and seeks to liberate us and all humanity from the evil that dehumanises individuals, communities and our world. Not just 'evil spirits' (however we might interpret this in our modern world), but those structural evils that oppress, marginalise, discriminate against our sisters and brothers; and those evils that lead us to war instead of peace, poverty instead of a fair distribution of the world's resources; those evils that pollute our planet as well as our minds, and stop us acting urgently to heal our planet before it is too late. Will we challenge these same evils in the name and prophetic power of Jesus Christ?

[2] We will mark both Racial Justice Sunday and Holocaust Memorial Day as well as pray for Peace in Gaza and the West Bank during our Mass. (Remember our stained glass window of Ss Maximilian Kolbe, Edith Stein and the Holocaust Martyrs at the Lady Chapel (to the right of our entrance). As a diverse community we need to witness to the joy of 'difference' and diversity and witness our revulsion at all forms of discrimination and anti-semitism. With all our ethnicities and beliefs, we are One Human Race, One Family!

<u>NEXT SUNDAY:</u> [1] On the **Fifth Sunday of Year B** we celebrate Jesus who heals human woundedness, challenges evil that dehumanises us and seeks God in solitude and prayer. Joint Meeting of the three key committees serving the parish met yesterday to further discussion on the future development of the parish with a servant-leadership team ('Community Elders') working with a non-resident priest (Fr Richard after September). A full 'Foundation Document' was agreed and has been posted on our parish website. A shortened form will be distributed to everyone in the next couple of weeks. Groups are being set up to explain and discuss in the context of prayerful synodal conversations throughout Lent and will be major part of our Lenten journey to which all of us are asked to participate. There will also be a strong call to prayer during Lent - all part of our whole community sharing in the discernment and decision-making in these 8 months of transition to a 'New Way of Being Church'. It is expected that the Community Elders will be in place by the Feast of Pentecost at the end of May. We ask you to discuss and pray about this Parish Strategy, sharing the discernment.

Pope Calls A Year of Prayer Preparing for the Jubilee Year of Hope 2025. Pope Francis invites us to hold a 'Year of Prayer' 2024, to deepen our prayer life as individuals and as the Church as we prepare for the Jubilee Year 2025 - a Jubilee of Hope, building towards a more Synodal Church. Pope Francis emphasises especially the Prayer of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and the 'Lectio Divina', prayer reflection upon the Word of God. Let us reflect how as a parish community we might embrace this call to deeper prayer, seeking personal and communal renewal.

that our parish, together with all churches and voluntary organisations around the country, has not yet recovered fully from the effects of the Covid Pandemic and the restrictions placed upon our meeting together during that time. However there has been great difficulty in drawing members of the parish into being part of the many ministries and tasks of the parish. Whether it is the SVP, the welcoming Ministry, Church Cleaning, the Foodbank, Catechists, too few are doing too much in support of the parish's life and mission. We are all called by our baptism to serve and build the Church as a mission community. We are all called to sacrifice time and energy to build our parish community and supports the Mission of Christ entrusted to us. I realise only too well that many have heavy commitments caring for children or elderly family members and juggling work and family. They are indeed serving Christ in these ways. But I do ask everyone to reflect whether some time can be given to sustain the parish's life and mission as we move towards a lay-led parish.
