PASSION SUNDAY - HOLY WEEK BEGINS



HOSANNA TO CRUCIFY HIM!

'Behold your King comes! Riding on a donkey!' The King on a beast of burden, for He carries the burden of the sin of the world, of the inhumanity that children of God are capable of. The donkey, the impure animal carrying the holiest of all our brothers and sisters - but a holiness that refuses to protect itself in sacred aura, but rather dives into the world of the impure to bring a love that purifies and cleanses.

They acclaim Him with Royal title - 'Son of David' and greet him with the ancient Battle cry - 'Hosanna!' as He rides towards the greatest of battles and the strangest of victories: the battle against hate and brutality, sin and unforgiveness; the Victory of Life over Death, Peace over Violence. He rides towards the Drama that will see Unconquerable Love born forever among us from the wounded lance-opened side of the Servant King enthroned upon the wood of the Cross and crowned with the thorns of the world's pain. These Palms of Victory that carry the scent of pain and death - for Life!

GOOD FRIDAY UNITED OPEN-AIR WAY OF THE CROSS

Begins with at St Nicks at 11.00am, walks up Stapleton Road and St Mark's Road, concluding at St Mark's Baptist Church around 1.00pm. We walk with Cross as witnesses to Christ's sacrificing love through our local community, praying for the needs of this community.

SOLEMN LITURGY OF THE PASSION *at 3.00pm (live-streamed on Parish Website)*

This meditative and moving Liturgy includes the Proclamation of the Passion, Veneration of the Cross, Solemn Intercessions, and Mass of the Pre-Sanctified. This is the most important Service of the Day, so please prioritise attending the Liturgy of the Passion

Prayer around the Cross at 7.00pm

Come for a little while quietly around the Cross, pondering this great mystery of Love and remembering Jesus as he is taken down from the Cross and laid in a borrowed Tomb

HOLY SATURDAY: 'Tenebrae' Morning Prayer at 9.30am

Today, we wait in stillness by the Tomb of Christ, the Crucified God. The Church celebrates no Sacraments, but holds a silent, mournful but hope-filled vigil at the tomb, waiting for death to explode into life with the dawn of Easter. Come and pray awhile waiting with love for the Divine Lover to wake from Sabbath rest and liberate the captive slaves of death as it's power is destroyed.

+++ The Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ +++

HOLY SATURDAY: THE VIGIL MASS OF EASTER at 9.00pm

This is the greatest Mass of the year, one for which we prepare most especially. throughout Lent. We keep vigil into the dark hours of the night, opening ourselves in prayer, Word and song to the Rising of the Light of Christ's Resurrection Glory. Every shadow of death scattered! Every member of our parish family should be a part of the great Vigil Mass. Let us fill the church! During our Vigil, we have the joy of welcoming into Full Communion and Confirmation of Gabe and Gray We also renew our Baptismal Commitment to Christ; affirming our faith in the Gospel of Life and limitless love; decide afresh to be a community of faith and proclamation.

There is an Agape after the Easter Vigil: please bring some food to share - I will look after the liquids! Please bring your offering of food to the Parish Hall before the Vigil begins. [The Vigil Mass fulfils your Easter obligation, but you are warmly invited also to the Easter Morning Mass, a very different Liturgy]

EASTER DAY: SOLEMN DAY MASS OF EASTER with Child Baptisms at 10.00am (streamed on Parish Website)

EASTER MONDAY: Adoration at 9.30am Mass at 10.00am

PLEASE NOTE: IN THE ANCIENT TRADITION OF THE CHURCH, RECONCILIATION WILL NOT BE CELEBRATED AFTER THE WEDNESDAY OF HOLY WEEK.

<u>TODAY:</u> [1] HOLY WEEK BEGINS with the Celebration of Passion (Palm) Sunday - we begin the great drama of the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We bless and process with Palms - the ancient sign of victory, hailing a King, who will win our victory by embracing the failure of the Cross. We welcome our King who will be enthroned on the wood of the Cross, crowned only with thorns and whose death becomes our Life.

NEXT SUNDAY: EASTER CELEBRATIONS!! We celebrate the incomparable joy of Love's victory over hatred, Life's victory over death, Light's victory over all darkness, Holiness' victory of sin. The Spirit raises the dead Jesus into our Risen Living and Lifegiving Lord. As we celebrate with joy the welcoming into Full Communion and Confirmation with Gabe and Gray during our Vigil Mass and the baptism of a number of our child catechumens on Easter morning, we too renew the promises of our baptism and commit ourselves to serving the Kingdom, living the Resurrection and being Good News to the Poor of the world.

BISHOP DECLAN RETIRES - A NEW BISHOP APPOINTED It was announced this past week that Pope Francis has accepted Bishop Declan's retirement on health grounds and has appointed as our new Bishop Canon Bosco MacDonald, currently Dean (or Parish priest) of Clifton Cathedral. We give thanks for Bishop Declan's 23 years in service of our diocese and pray for a fulfilling retirement. And we pray for Bishop-Elect Bosco that the Holy Spirit will guide him as he serves our diocese in this new as Chief Pastor of the Church of Clifton.

PRE-EASTER CELEBRATION OF RECONCILIATION (Confession) Lent is a journey we take together as a community - a journey of Repentance, of turning back to the Lord, a journey of renewal in the Holy Spirit of God's love and mercy. The Church encourages us to express this journey by celebrating the Sacrament of God's Mercy - the Sacrament of Reconciliation (see below), so that our hearts are truly prepared for our recommitment as disciples of the Risen Christ this Easter ('Renewal of Baptismal Promises'). Please see the times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, especially in the early part of Holy Week. **We observe the ancient tradition of the Church by celebrating Reconciliation up to the Wednesday of Holy Week, but not after that day** - so that we are well prepared to celebrate the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night).

'ALL ARE WELCOME IN THIS PLACE' It is our privilege to host here at St Nicks the Diocesan Ministry among the LBGTQ+ community. It would be a great sign of welcome, valuing 'Gay' Catholics, if more parishioners would come sometimes to our 3rd Sunday a month Mass with our LGBTQ+ friends. Do try to come occasionally and share with us.
