Come find life in the House of Love!

God calls us to find ourselves, welcomes us into the intimacy of the 'House of Love' that God is. God is not a lonely isolated power, not the all-powerful rule maker demanding obedience! Rather God is a community of love, a network of relationships into which we are drawn, and from whom we have our origin.

We are made in God's image and likeness - made to be complete and whole only in relationship with others. Like God we too are a network of relationships. Relationships give us the greatest joy in life - and the greatest suffering too. Precisely because love is so life-giving, then the denial or the abuse of love is so death-bearing.

Love is always a risk - a risk God took in creating us, in sending His Beloved Son to us, in entrusting their shared love, the Holy Spirit to our hearts. God risks pouring all His Love into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. The Church is God's great risk of loving the world - through us in all our weakness and failure. The sole purpose of the Church is to be God's love today!

We are made in God's likeness - our dignity lies more in our being than just in the value of our doing! God loves us for who we are, not because of what we do!

[2] We celebrate very appropriately today the **Baptism** of Oscar Browning in the name of

the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Pleas pray for him and his family.

[4] Retiring Collection for Emergency Famine Relief in Sudan - through CAFOD. Because of the brutal civil war seven million people have been displaced and millions are facing starvation. This is the biggest human catastrophe in our world at this time - please be as generous as possible.

NEXT SUNDAY: [1] We celebrate the **Feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ ('Corpus Christi')**. Week by week we gather around the Table of the Eucharist at the loving invitation of Jesus our Brother and Lord ... week by week we are fed by the Sacrament of His endless loving, the Bread of Life and the Cup of His Love. This great Sacrament, this sacred encounter with the utter reality of the Risen and Ascended Christ faithfully remaining with us, is food for our journey, medicine for our healing and the bond of love that unites us with God and each other - the leads us into communion with the world around us. How can we not come and eat and drink with Him and of Him? How else will we grow in His Love and Life, and find the nourishment needed to fulfil the Mission he has given us?

[2] Thank you **Epiphania**, for 'breaking the Bread of the Word' for us on this Feast.

[3] We have the joy of **Receiving into Full Communion and Confirming in the Holy Spirit** David Carter. He is new to our community - he experienced the Journey of Faith and the Rite of Election in Portsmouth Diocese, but then moved here to Bristol. As a result we have been able to welcome him among us and complete his initiation into full Communion withthe catholic Church here is our parish. Please welcome David and pray for him.

[4] In honour of the Feast of Corpus Christi, Mass will conclude with a period of **Adora**-

tion of the Blessed Sacrament and a Solemn Benediction.

June is dedicated to pondering the immensity of divine humanity - God with a human heart Who loves us beyond the breaking of His Heart. God is at least as vulnerable and tender, open to experiencing our pain (such is the depth of His love) as He is all-powerful. He is both creator and pain-bearer. The Sacred Heart of Jesus calls us to enter into His opened, pierced Heart and find there our home, the source of our poor loving, and the woundedness that will heal every wound of our hearts and lives. Not only does His love pour out like water of life on the dry ground of our desert loveless Earth, but He invites us to come and enter in to His own pain-bearing, ever forgiving and peace-making Heart and become a flame of His love cast upon the Earth, a co-worker with Him in the endless task of re-shaping the world and our sisters and brothers in the gentle power of the Divine Love in us and through us! ALLELUIA!!
