

SECOND COMING - IMPOSSIBLE!?

Awake to the 'signs of the times' and ready for action!
- [2] The First Sunday of Advent is the 'Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees'. This annual Day of Prayer was inaugurated by Pope Francis and could not be more timely in the light of the proposed legislation from the Home Office and how political leadership has betrayed our beloved refugee community by seeking to pass draconian and inhuman measures and restrictions.
- [3] Meeting after 10.00am Mass for parents of children to be prepared for First Eucharist or First Reconciliation in 2025
- **NEXT SUNDAY** [1] The **Second Sunday of Advent** celebrates that God sent John the Baptist 'to prepare the Way of the Lord', to open His People's hearts to repentance, straightening our twisted ways so that the Christ of God could enter in and reign through love in our lives. Advent is a 'penitential season' (hence the purple vestments), a call to wake up to our need to change direction. Let us not be afraid to 'change our ways' so that we can walk in the Way of Christ, the Way of love and justice. And we are also called to be John the Baptist to others, calling our world, society, nation to 'change its ways' by listening to 'the cries of the poor, the cries of the Earth'.

ADVENT - THE VISION OF MISSION

Advent is a time for 'people with far-seeing eyes' - awakened to the reality of our world, ready to listen and to gaze: in order to recognise where, when and how Jesus comes in the 21st century (in the poverty, among the oppressed, disguised as an addict or as homeless, crying out for acceptance and freedom in the asylum-seeker, yearning for peace among the women and children who are the greatest victims of our wars). But you have to have courage to see and to hear - and more courage to speak and to act! The Spirit of God unfolds a vision of Mission - to transform the deserts and wastelands of our world into places of hope, rich and fertile in humanity and justice, healing and freedom. Our Mission is world-challenging and world-changing. Let our worship empower our mission, as we gaze upon bread from the fields and wine from the hills being transformed utterly in Christ by the Spirit and the Word through the ministry of the Church!

THE YEAR OF MATTHEW Throughout the new Liturgical Year (A) most Sundays we will be proclaiming the Gospel of St Matthew. This is the most Jewish of the Gospels, arising from the life experience (and so the questions and issues) of a first century Christian community composed mostly of Jews who had embraced Jesus as the Messiah they had long awaited. The author seems to have been a rabbi as many rabbinical techniques are used in this Gospel (eg grouping miracles, healings, parables in groups of seven). Jesus is presented as a New Moses giving a New Law (the Beatitudes) that fulfils and surpasses the Old Law. At a time when Christian Jews were excommunicated from the Synagogues and Jerusalem and its Temple lay in ruins at the hands of the Roman Army, the author is seeking to reassure them that they were being faithful to God's Covenant with His people in accepting Jesus, Messiah and Son of God ... they were faithful Jews by becoming Christians: the Gospel concludes with the Universal Mission ('all nations') entrusted to them by the Risen and Glorious Christ at the mountain of the Ascension.
