**JESUS - WORD & WISDOM OF GOD  
MADE FLESH, PITCHED TENT HERE!**

Have you ever been camping under canvas? If so you know you are vulnerable to weather conditions, you are open to whoever comes - no locked doors. But there is also great freedom to go where you will - just pack up your tent and move on, exploring new places and sights. And of course there are the Nomadic Peoples who whole life is wandering from place to place, hoping they will be welcomed!

God in Jesus is the great 'Tent Dweller' - the Nomad wandering among His People - the Pilgrim God who is constantly journeying through history, accompanying humanity in peace and in war - in plenty and in poverty. We too often want to 'lock God up' in our churches and temples, in our tabernacles and creeds, in our sacraments and rituals. BUT THE SPIRIT BLOWS WHERE SHE WILLS! Our God who pitched tent in creation's history, among us, cannot be contained. God is freedom - Love's freedom. God surprises us in how and when He draws alongside and whispers in our heart. We find Him where we think He should not be if only we seek his face and open to His Love! 'Let us see your face O Lord' in all around us!

**TODAY** [1] With the **Second Sunday of Christmas** we continue our celebration and contemplation of the wonder of the Word made Flesh dwelling among us, full of grace and truth. Jesus is God's Wisdom, journeying among us. In the incarnation of the Word and Wisdom of God in the Child of Mary, the Child of Bethlehem, God has entered into human history - indeed in the evolution of our planet and Universe! God is involved the joy and pain, hopes and despairs of humanity - will we also live a spirituality and discipleship of involvement in the world's development?

**NEXT SUNDAY** [1] The Christmas Season draws to a close as we celebrate **the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**. In Jesus adulthood, he commits Himself to His Father's vision for His life on Earth, commits Himself to the Father's Word and Mission, which would lead him to the Sacrifice of the Cross - the ultimate abandonment of Himself in trust into the Father's Hands! This abandonment is glimpsed when He stayed in the Temple at the age of 13 and found a new depth in His submitting to John's Baptism in the Jordan River. **Jesus invites us today to renew our baptismal commitment, and abandon ourselves into God's hands, because He is our Father!**

**FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - A FEAST OF GLORY MANIFESTED!**

Seekers after wisdom have travelled far, and bring with them the hopes of the Nations, the gifts of the Peoples, the riches of Learning - and lay them before this vulnerable little child trapped in poverty and soon to be a refugee! These strong men of intellect who gaze upon the stars and research the wisdom of ages in their books: now they bend low, humbled and humbling in the generosity of their spirits and the humility of their minds - bending the knee to the child and His young mother and labourer father. And in the poverty of the Bethlehem home they touch the quiet and hidden glory of Love made Flesh, of God in human skin, of the inter-twining of the Divine and Human stories forever - literally for all eternity. They have found Wisdom - or rather Wisdom made Flesh has found them! drawing them to the strange Glory of this God-touched Humanity. Forever we will walk as wise seekers and lovers! Then the Glory can be quietly and gently manifest in us!

**HAPPY NEW YEAR** A New Year is a time for reflection upon the past, and commitment to the future. Our Faith is a faith in the future - the future God and ourselves will forge together for our own lives and for the world. Our Faith is a faith in God's New Beginnings, who always redeems and heals the mistakes and tragedies of the past and launches us confidently upon the paths of the future. Our Faith is faith in a God who walks with us through dark threatening valleys and light-filled joyous mountain tops - and helps us see the creativity and beauty of both! I wish you every blessing this New Year - let us together make it a Year of Mission, a Year of Contemplation, a Year of Friendship with our Emmanuel, our God who walks always at our side in our hearts.

**FEAST OF MARY THE MOTHER OF GOD**

The first defined doctrine concerning Mary was to name her 'Theotokos' - Greek for 'Bearer of God'. This was solemnly declared by the Council of Ephesus (where Mary was believed to have ended her life and then been assumed into heaven): you

can visit the 'holy house' reputed to be the home she shared with John the Beloved Disciple into whose care Jesus placed his mother at the Cross.

Mary is the great sign from God showing us what it is to be a redeemed people, what it is to let the Spirit grasp hold of our lives and shape them in the service of the Lord and his Kingdom. She is the 'bearer of God' to the world - and that is our vocation too! If we are to bear Christ to our 21st Century world then we need to allow the Spirit to overshadow us, we need to utter our profound 'YES' to God, we need to abandon ourselves to the divine will and love, we need to embrace God's world as Mary did! Let Mary teach us in 2012 how to bear God with our whole being and all our love!

**PRAY FOR THIS WEEK'S PARISH MINISTRY OR MISSION** We pray for our **Proclaimers of the Word**, co-ordinated by Lucy Lourenco. **NEWS ABOUT THE WILLOW TREE IN OUR CAR PARK** Some of you may know that twice in the past four years a major branch of this beautiful tree broke away from its trunk, most recently two months ago. After consultation with Diocesan Property Services we have sadly commissioned Tree surgeons to remove the tree. It presents an unacceptable risk to children in the school, users of the car park and property - cars, the Dunstan Centre etc. A beautiful tree sadly in the wrong place!

**FURNITURE AVAILABLE AS PRESBYTERY BEING LEASED** At last the diocesan authorities have agreed to our proposal that the vacant presbytery be leased for an initial 4 years to ACH (Ashley Community Housing) for provide accommodation for homeless refugees. This accords with our mission to the most marginalised and deprived of our city and to alleviate at least a little the homelessness crisis our city faces. As a result there are items of furniture to be cleared from the house. We invite anyone interested in these items - all we ask is a reasonable donation to parish funds.
